UPDATE ON SUBMISSION OF THE JOINT MELKSHAM NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN 2

What's happening now?

The review of the adopted Joint Melksham Neighbourhood Plan is now complete and following the unanimous approval of the latest draft (Submission Version: September 2024) by the Steering Group, Melksham Town Council and Melksham Without Parish Council in late September and early October the Plan has now moved to the next important stage. The Plan, and its suite of evidence documents, have now been submitted to Wiltshire Council where it will be subject to a further 6-week consultation period, and then on to Examination and eventual Referendum. We will notify you of these various stages, including further adverts in the Melksham News.

You spoke. We listened.

Over the past two years, the Steering Group have been part of the local voices that have shaped this Neighbourhood Plan. From online surveys to drop-in events, to working meetings and research, and most recently with consultations on draft versions of the Plan, we've aimed to make sure this Plan responds to our shared local ambitions and concerns. We've also listened to what 'statutory' consultees, such as Wiltshire Council and the Environment Agency said. Alongside this, many businesses, landowners and their agents have also put forward their views about what the Plan should address. This is all summarised in a Consultation Statement - this includes responses to over 1300 comments from the Autumn 2023 and Summer 2024 consultations from the Steering Group.
